## BOYS BASKETBALL

### Kearsarge 55, Hopkinton 52

Kearsarge picked up a strong road victory at Hopkinton 55-52 Jan. 3.

Lots of key players stepped up under pressure to make this game a memorable one for the Cougars.

Eli Whipple led Kearsarge with 16 points, followed by Austin Needham with 15 and Ajay Tremblay with 12.

Noah Whipple added eight rebounds, while Blake Grieco, Davin Boehle and Bragen Kinzer all played great defense.

Kearsarge took an early lead 20-8 after one quarter and 20-17 at the half. The Hawks stormed back in the second half cutting

the lead to 36-33 after three quarters. Clutch free throws late by Tremblay, Needham and Whipple sealed the win for Kearsarge.

“This was a great team effort on the road in a tough environment,” Kearsarge boys basketball coach Nate Camp said. “I’m so proud of the way we stuck together under some adversity on the road against a very good Hopkinton team. We really grinded on defense down the stretch and made clutch free throws.”

### Newport 69, Monadnock 61

Newport put together a solid second half to overcome Monadnock 69-61 Jan. 3 at the Wheeler Gym.

Newport was led by balanced scoring with Christian Forsythe tossing in 23 points, Aaron Fellows with 22, Adrian Sanchez 14 and Tyson DiPaola 9.

The game was close throughout three quarters before the Tigers put some distance between them and the Huskies in the final frame.

Monadnock led 32-31 at the half before the Tigers turned the tables and took a 49-45 lead after three quarters and cruised to the win in the final quarter.

## GIRLS BASKETBALL

### Newport 58, Monadnock 50

Newport took a 20-point lead in the second half and then held on to win at Monadnock 58-50 Jan. 3.

The Tigers led 28-16 at the half and 41-31 headed into the final quarter. The Huskies made a run

in the fourth quarter but the Tigers withstood the challenge to pick up a huge Division III win.

Monadnock did a good job against Newport’s leading scorer Taylor Fellows holding the talented senior to eight points. Fellows made up for it by facilitating and setting up teammates Zoey Lord, who led the Tigers with 20 points, Skylar Nelson with 16 and Torrence Williams with 12.
